

Cancer treatment induced alopecia: interest of a socio hairdresser

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Introduction

Alopecia is one of the most feared secondary effect of anticancer chemotherapy: It concerned up to 44% of chemotherapy treated patients (1).

Up to 8% of patients undergoing endocrine therapy stop their anti-aromatase treatment due to therapy induced alopecia (2).

In addition to the presence of a socio-esthetician, the "Centre Georges François Leclerc (France)" decided to add a socio-hairdresser in the supportive care department.

Materials

An auxilliary nurse, already graduated as hairdresser 30 years ago, was graduated socio-hairdresser from the socio-hairderssing academy in Anglet (France) in 2021.

She was posted as halftime socio hairdresser at the Centre Georges François Leclerc (France) from February 2022.

Methodology

1) Individual support in their hospital room, depending on the patient's problem:

- Explain the different possible phases of alopecia according to oncological treatment
- Personalized advice according to patient's particular problem for the presenting alternatives related to hair loss: hair prosthesis, turban, fringe
- Intermediate haircut before wearing the hair prosthesis
- Scalp massage

2) Setting up 2-hour collective workshops for a 6 patients group:

- Hair prosthesis workshop: how to maintain patients hair prosthesis, how to wash it, dry it, restyle it, use of suitable products for the maintenance of the hair prosthesis.
- How to position your hands to perform a scalp massage yourself and advice on the use of products adapted to your scalp problem.
- Turban, scarf tying and accessories workshops: presentation of different turbans, personalized tips.

Results

592 patients were given councils or hair care for 2023.

The activity is detailed below:

Accompanying hair loss: 237 patients

Phone call: 113 patients Councils for hair care: 55

Accompanying hair regrowth: 40

Wig councils: 40

Haircut and council during chemotherapy: 33

Scalp massage: 27

Shampoo, haircut and drying: 26

Men haircut : 12 Miscellaneous : 9
